

Back Garden Design - TW7

OUTLINE OF THE DESIGN/BUILD PROCESS:

Firstly, we will produce a concept drawing(s), which will show you the look of the garden. You can then provide feedback and any amendments can be incorporated, if necessary.

A video fly-through of the garden will then be produced, so you can easily visualise the final product.

The initial quote will also be drawn up, using materials we feel are appropriate. This will give you a good indication of the cost of the work. This quote will also include a price for planting, based on our standard, meter squared rate.

Most customers will book in at this point, to avoid delay. We typically have a 10-12 week lead time, during which finer details can be worked out with our Project Manager, Jordan.

This is a design-build service, so in order to keep design fees as low as possible, we don't produce Orders of Work or written Specifications.

The planting price in the quote is calculated on a Square Meter rate. This price includes:

- Meeting with Adam, our Plant Specialist, to discuss your requirements.
- Handpicked selection and delivery of a suitable range of trees, shrubs, perennials and climbers. These plants are typically, but not limited to: 2 - 3L Perennials, 3 - 10L Shrubs, 7.5 - 15L Trees, 3 - 6L Climbers.
- Setting out and planting of the plants in your garden, with appropriate compost and fertilizer.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Special requirements, such as large trees, mature shrubs or hedge planting are not covered by our Square Meter rate and we will quote such items on an individual basis, as required.

We have a national network of specialist, wholesale suppliers and can source practically any plant available to UK customers.

Planting plans, concept drawings and plant lists, although not necessary, are available at additional cost.
